## What We Are Learning

Reading: Students will begin the year reading fictional stories and retelling the key details: characters, setting, problem, solution, and sequence of events (RL1.2). We will read stories that teach the characters an important lesson and discuss the central message together. We will also practice different independent literacy centers (Daily 5).

Writing: Students will learn to write personal narratives ("small moments") in which they can recount events in sequence using words that identify specific order of events (W1.3). We will begin the school year reviewing and practicing correct sentence structure (complete sentences/fragments, punctuation, capitalization).

Math: We will start the year practicing counting on from any number up to 150 (NBT1.1). Students will also practice reading and writing numbers up to 100. You can practice this at home by saying a number out loud and having your student count on out loud, write it down and represent it with a picture, ten frames or tally marks.
Students will begin to understand that the digits in a two-digit number represent amounts of tens and ones (NBT1.2)

Social Studies: This quarter's social studies unit begins with reviewing rules, expectations, and procedures. Students will understand the importance of rules in different communities and having authority figures. (1.C.1, 1.G.1).
