## What We Are Learning

Reading: Students have begun learning the Daily 5 centers. This includes read to self, work on writing, word work and listening to reading (Raz-Kids). We will also soon begin guided reading groups. Students have also been reviewing short vowel sounds and diagraphs (ch, th,wh,sh). We will also continue asking and answering questions about fictional stories (RL1.1) and next week, non-fiction texts (R.I. 1.1).

Writing: Students will continue working on personal narratives (Small moments) for the rest of the quarter. This includes learning how to hook the reader (introduction), transitional words, how to sequence, how to edit with a peer, including details in their writing/illustrations, and how to write a closing (W.1.3).

Math: Students have been doing a terrific job understanding place value and understanding that the digits in a two-digit number represent the amounts of tens and ones (i.e. 85 is made up of 8 tens and 5 ones) (NBT.1.2). We will soon begin organizing, representing and asking/answering questions about sets of data (MD1.4).

Social Studies: Students will review the importance of rules in different communities (1.C.1, 1.G.1). We will spend time discussing various ways conflicts can be resolved in homes, classrooms, and communities (1.C.1, 1.G.1). Next, we will move on to a science unit about force and motion (pushes, pulls, and balancing) (P1.1).
